2016 Town and Village Renewal Scheme Background and Response

- Background
 - Rural towns adversely impacted by recent economic challenges (CEDRA Report)
 - General poor environment in which to live or visit
 - Empty shops and abandoned buildings
 - Vacant lands and unexploited/undeveloped amenities
- Response
 - A Programme for a Partnership Government
 - Town and Village Renewal a top priority
 - New and improved Town and Village Renewal Scheme for 2017
 - Additional funding to support the development of rural towns

2016 Town and Village Renewal SchemeObjectives and Focus

- To be approved projects must provide;
 - Enhanced attractiveness of towns and villages
 - Enhanced local environment and local amenities
 - Promotion of local heritage, potential for tourism, centres of culture

2016 Town and Village Renewal Scheme Types of Activities to be Supported

- Public consultation costs
- Commissioning of 'health checks'
- Streetscape and environmental enhancement
- Enhancement of Heritage and other community assets
- Shop Front Enhancement
- Pursuit of Quality Marks (Purple Flag, Heritage Town)
- Playgrounds, Leisure Facilities
- Car Parking
- Safety and Accessibility enhancements
- Training initiatives e.g. Marketing for retailers
- Branding and Marketing of a town/village
- Targeted actions to support housing and commercial development

2016 Town and Village Renewal Scheme Terms and Conditions

- Eligible Towns
 - Population <10000 (0-5000 and 5000–10000)
- Proposals/Applications
 - Prepared by a Town/Village Renewal Committee
 - Based on a Town/Village 'Health Check'
 - Must be consistent with broader Development Plans
 - Consultation required with LCDC and LECP/Leader Rural Development Strategy
 - Applications lodged by Friday 30th September, 2016
 - A maximum of **8** projects

2016 Town and Village Renewal Scheme Funding

- 2016 Grant of **€380,000** per County
 - Co-financing grant at a **maximum** rate of 85%
 - At <u>least</u> 15% local authority match funding
 - Total minimum 2016 finance from KCC is €67,000
 - Total Max/Min grant available for 2016 is <u>€450,000</u>
- Management of Expectations
 - Total Value of 2014 Urban and Village Renewal Schemes in Callan, Thomastown, Graiguenamanagh and Ballyragget €2.5 million
 - 5.5 x TVRS Grant 2016

2016 Town and Village Renewal Scheme Issues to Consider

- Over 40 urban centres throughout County that qualify
- Acknowledgement of the huge level of community work ongoing throughout County Kilkenny
 - Submissions received from some communities
- Projects selected must be realistic in the context of the available budget - €450k (2016) v €2.5m (2014)
- Selected Projects must provide a visible benefit
 - 4 Schemes x €112500 <u>v</u> 8 Schemes x €56250
- Geographical Distribution (4 Electoral Districts)

2016 Town and Village Renewal Scheme Issues to Consider

- Commitment in Programme for Government for a multi-annual TVRS Programme
 - Kilkenny County Council Budget 2017 onwards
 - 85% state funds v 15% Council Funds in 2016
 - Establishment of MD TVRS Sub- Committees
 - Integration of TVRS with other service/budgetary areas
 - Integration with other initiatives
- Local Area Plan context and compatibility
- LECP context (level of deprivation/tourism/economic)
- Current local context/health check

2016 Town and Village Renewal Scheme Suggested/Recommended Applications

- 4 Applications, 1 per Electoral District/Area
 - Urlingford
 - Kells
 - Ballyhale
 - Piltown
- Average value of each application = €112,500
- Nature of applications (subject to discussions with TVRS Committee);
 - Streetscape Enhancement
 - Amenity/Tourism Walks and Facilities
 - Infrastructure enhancements
- Applications consistent with LAPs, LCDC/LECP, LDS (Leader)
- Applications prepared by Kilkenny County Council
